Health protection is our major concern. We ensure the quality of our products and provide healthy products to consumers and maximum profit to the producers," said Jacob Pulikkan.

Training Programme

Training programmes on development of traditional and local products are being held as part of the festival in Gandhi Bhavan. Training in soap making, jewel making, umbrella making, paper bag making, and manufacturing food products are being conducted by the movement.
